From the Pastor:

May is an interesting month with two widely recognized special days with a call to "honor and remember" – Mother's Day (May 12th) ... Memorial Day (May 27th) ... But then, there are also 49 month long celebrations (like Mental Health Awareness Month), seven special weeks including "Teacher Appreciation Week (5/6-10), and over 200 special "days" (like "No Dirty Dishes Day" coinciding with Nat'l Visit Your Relatives Day on the 18th hmmm?). In the Church, we celebrate two spiritual holy-days – Ascension Day (May 9th) and Pentecost (May 19th).

Pentecost is often referred to as the birthday of the church when, as Jesus promised, the Holy Spirit empowered the believers in a new way to carry the message of new life, hope and healing to the world. There are times that the Holy Spirit is spoken about as if only coming into existence at Pentecost – but the disciples had ministered in the Holy Spirit with power before Pentecost as they were sent out by Jesus. Prophets and kings had ministered in the anointing and power of God as well before, but Jesus specifically "commanded [the disciples] not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait for what the father had promised, Which, He said, "you heard of from Me; for John baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." (Acts 1:4-5). The gift of the Holy Spirit was to have a profound effect upon the believers and the ministry such that Jesus said, "I tell you the truth, it is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper [paracletos – one called alongside to help] shall not come to you; but if I go, I will send Him to you." [John 16: 7] Pause and think about that for a moment – "It is to your advantage that I go..." Jesus wanted you and me to be empowered with the same Spirit that rested on and in Him in His people. So, what is the Spirit to do?... (John 16:8-14)

- 1. Convict the world about sin, righteousness, and judgment;
- 2. Guide you into all the truth;
- 3. Disclose to you what is to come;
- 4. Glorify Jesus;
- 5. Take what is of Jesus and disclose it to us;
- 6. Make us witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and the remote parts of the earth. (Acts 1:8)

As we read through the New Testament – we see the affects, not only at Pentecost, but throughout the unfolding history of the church the work and ministry of the Holy Spirit through the believers. I cannot imagine a greater endorsement of the work and importance of the Holy Spirit in the life of the believer and the church than to have Jesus say – "It's to your advance *that I go...*" so that the Holy Spirit would come in this new way, new anointing, new empowerment upon the believer. Next time you question if you have what it takes to continue to serving Jesus – just pause and think of the promise of the Holy Spirit. You and I were not meant to do it on our own. Allow the "fire" of the Holy Spirit to warm your heart, empower your ministry, inspire your worship, confirm your faith, and fill you with life. May your life be immersed in His Spirit!

In response to some inquiries I am including the info on the church activity last years as to our support of missions. Some of these items are ongoing and some are monthly and some are budgeted items. In 2023 we gave the following to the missionaries that we support though budgeted amounts.

Heinsmans/Team \$1300.00 Pahutskis/Pioneers \$1300.00 Samuteb Hospital 700.00 Our Daily Bread \$100.00

In addition these we support through our monthly special offerings, On these what comes during the month goes directly out to the mission.

January - AMMI \$225.00

February -JOY \$998.00 (Some people give to this all year long and everything goes to

March -Lenten Offering \$205.00 (This is decided each year by the board to support a special need. In 2023 it went to Back to school blessing through the NL Ministerium.

April – Camping \$425.00 Usually on one of the months we get a special offering for what was Camping Scholarships. With the few campers we are supporting right now we have changed April, to NL Ministerium. We do have people that support Gretna Glenn on a regular basis and anything that comes in for Gretna or the Camping scholarships we give directly to the Camp.

May -UMCOR \$1058.00 Disaster relief through One Great Hour of Sharing

June -Red Rose \$6245.00 The Trustees are supposed to designate a project each year for this offering. None was designated in 2023.

July-ALIGN \$350.00 August -LCCM \$825.00

September -Shoebox \$1200.00 This is for the shoebox postage for the boxes we fill. This is handled

through Samaritans Purse.

October – Lebanon Rescue Mission \$1735.00 November -Bill Lovelace \$330.00

December -NL Ministerium \$1294.00 Each year December is designated by the Ad. Board. In 2023 It was decided to give it to The newly formed Northern Lebanon Ministerium to help with start up costs.

Usually on one of the months we get a special offering for what was Camping Scholarships. With the few campers we are supporting right now we have changed that to April, NL Ministerium. We do have people that support Gretna Glenn on a regular basis and anything that comes in for Gretna or the Camping scholarships we give directly to the Camp.

I hope this helps clear up any questions on the missions of JUMC and how the offerings are designated.

In the future I will try to update more often probably on a quarterly basis.
