# Pastor's Pen

NEW CHALLENGES AND NEXT STEPS

The church has been facing some powerful challenges over the last years. Not only the COVID-19 crises and its various manifestations, but in relating to the spiritual and social upheaval and changes both around and within it. There have been detours and obstacles in its path as well as new challenges and opportunities to discover and engage in ministries that push boundaries once thought insurmountable. Some congregations have found ways to thrive, some survive, and some have fallen victim and are either struggling to exist or have already become a statistic. In the midst of the many hurdles confronted in the regular course of ministry life, we have also approached a crossroad as a part of a denomination that once promoted itself as a band of churches that held to historic faith with an impact that dynamically engaged the contemporary world with a message of grace, holiness, forgiveness, and sanctification.

The Church Council has been reflecting on some of the choices the congregation will encounter in the coming months and how to present the challenges to the congregation. A subgroup is gathering data about the various paths forward, one of which must be pursued in early fall if it is to meet a number of the United Methodist Church Discipline's requirements.

The July Church Council meeting became a model while discussing the realities of the situation at hand in the denomination that would not be its sole



focus. Also discussed were unfolding plans for a fall rally day that will begin with an interactive fun time and special ministry that will reach people of various ages and provide new pathways for new visions and opportunities for ministry in both the church and community.

We are so very grateful for leaders who don't allow the difficult to dissuade the possible. I think I understand what Paul wrote to the church at Philippi, *"I thank my* God in all my remembrance of you, always offering prayer with joy in my every prayer for you all, in view of your participation in the gospel from the first day until now. For I am confident of this very thing, that He Who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus" Philippians 1:3-6.

A sub-group of the Church Council will put together information sessions to try to capsulize the situation in the denomination and our local church in order for the path into the future to respond to the opportunities of God's calling rather than react to differences of positions. Pray for the leaders, and watch for the information gatherings if you desire more information and dialog. *"I thank my God in all my remembrance of you – always offering prayer with joy…."* ~Pastor Al

Hello Congregation from the office. In this case the garage of the trustee chair. Greetings also from the busy beavers trustees. We would like to update you on our current projects and completed fellowship hall shingle replacement which was started two weeks later than scheduled due to early summer rains and rescheduling of equipment. Once the date was locked in the job was completed in four days. We must say a big thank you to the owners of the property to the west of the church for allowing the contractor to access that side of the fellowship hall for the necessary equipment. The Fellowship hall, office, and carport roofs look fantastic. Thank you 'The Shingling Brothers.'

We appreciate the contributions to the Red Rose challenge for our boiler room chimney repair. Funds required for this project are close to our estimated costs. As with all businesses and contractors we are still working to get a second quote for this project.

Now some exciting news and information on our work in and around the parsonage. In

June the trustees had a Saturday work day at the church and parsonage prior to Red Rose. The parsonage group trimmed the low hanging limbs and weeds/brush along the property line on the west side, weeded around the garage, fences, and parsonage and started an inside major renovation of painting, wall paper removing, kitchen remodeling, and more. As this project has moved along other ideas have surfaced to do more. A father of one of our trustees has offered to help renovate the downstairs and upstairs bathrooms to include a shower in the downstairs bathroom. As I write this article, I am hoping by the time you read this, this additional work will be approved at our next trustee meeting. Also the parsonage team just decided to do a little more in the kitchen by putting in new counter tops, sink and faucet.

Another project a trustee is currently working on is a sound platform and cabinet for the sound system area in the rear of the sanctuary. Keep watching for it to appear.

Thanks to our busy beaver trustees, and when you get a minute thank them for their efforts, and if they don't grow weary we may fix the front steps to the sanctuary this fall!
