Pastor's Pen

I watched one of my grandsons open a huge tube of candy - what appeared to be a year's supply of "Sour Patch Kids" gummies. I watched as he popped one in his mouth. His forehead wrinkled. His cheeks sucked in. eves watered. Even though I was watching him from over 50 miles away in a video chat, even my forehead I couldn't wrinkled, my face twisted. help myself - I had to ask - "Why do you do that to yourself?!" His response – "I like them." I wasn't convinced even though he seemed to be. There are times that I feel I see a similar spirit in the society around us. Appearing to be convinced that a "sour spirit" is a desirable and should state be appreciated and understood by everyone around, there seem to be people across generations that appear convinced that this a healthy and valued status, a natural and acceptable Well. countenance to bear. convinced on good authority scriptures - that there is different "spirit" that should be providing motivation for action, a fragrance in the air around us, and a firm foundation beneath us.

The Bible says that there are some things that are somewhat the "Sour Spirit" version that people can both ingest into their lives or radiate in their day to day living and relationships. Paul says that some of the "fruit" that can direct our countenance and life "tastes" like: hate, discord, jealousy, anger, selfish ambition, dissension, envy (all from Galatians 5: 20-21), arrogance (2 Corinthians 12:20), greed (Ephesians 5:5)...



Just writing them makes my forehead wrinkle, my eyes squint, my nose twist, and my cheeks suck in with the thought – "Why would you do that to yourself?"

But, Paul tells us that the "fruit" of God's Spirit in us

should produce: (from Galatians 5:22-23) peace, patience, "love, joy, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, selfcontrol...." Can you join me in imagining a community where people choose the second set of tastes to fill their lives with rather than the first? While the two lists I've just given were written nearly 2,000 years ago, they stand as powerfully dynamic alternative life atmospheres today as they evidently were back then. While some seem to be convinced that living on "Sour Spirit" gummies is a natural choice for them, I believe people yearn to live in a "Fruit of the Spirit Salad" world. Evidently by the way Paul writes of them, the choice is ours. We can react with and to the broken human flesh ways of the "Sour Spirit Kids" or we can possess and offer to the world a sweet "Spirit fruit salad". Over the last several years it appears to me as if the society is spiraling out of control in one way and it is up to the children of God to choose to allow the Spirit of God to mold and shape us with the sweetness of the fruit of God's Spirit controlling our lives, manners, the very fragrance of our presence as the children of God in the world. Why not begin each day this year with a simple prayer - "Lord, may the fruit of Your Spirit be what those around me today will taste. May my relationships and encounters today be filled with love, joy, peace. patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Help me share with others that these are the fruit of Your Spirit in me. Amen."

A new year is before each of us. Behind are what we have done, been involved in, and maybe wishing some things were different. Many make resolutions for the new year. Scripture gives us many directions that provide wise, helpful, and life-changing resolutions.

Mark 12:29-31, Jesus speaks about which of all the commandments is the most important. "The most important one," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is One, love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' "The second is this, 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

Paul in 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 gave definition to *love*. "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not

easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hope, always perseveres."

Jesus in John 15 talks about the vine and the branches and being fruitful. Read verses 1-17. Verse 8, "This is to My Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be My disciples." Verses 16-17, "You did not choose Me, but I chose you, and appointed you to go and bear fruit, *fruit that will last*. Then the Father will give you whatever you ask in My name. This is my command! *Love each other*.

Peter gave consideration on exemplifying Christian graces in 2 Peter 1:5, 6, 7, "make every effort to add to your faith, goodness, and to goodness, knowledge, and to knowledge, self-control, and to self-control perseverance, and to perseverance, godliness, and to godliness, brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness, love."



Read 2 Peter 1:1-11 now.

Generosity it also to be considered. Consider Proverbs 3:9-10, 11:25, 22:9. Then hear Paul's words to Timothy in 1 Timothy 6:17-19. Verse 18, "Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share."

Psalm 119 gives thoughts for resolutions. For example, verses 9-16 ("I have hidden Your word in my heart that I might not sin against You"). And 119:105, "Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path."

Paul said this to Timothy, 2 Timothy 3:16, 17, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work."

Micah 6:6-8 gives this thought, "With what shall I come

before the Lord and bow down before the exalted God? (6) He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God" (8).

One final thought from Paul, your attire for the new year. Read Colossians 3 (whole chapter), verses 12-14, "Therefore, as God's chosen people holy and dearly loved, clothe yourself with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. Bear with each other and forgive what grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on *love*, which binds them all together in perfect unity." Verse 17, "and whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him." God's blessings be with you in 2023!

REDNER'S SAVE-A-TAPE


