So don't try to get out of anything prematurely. Let it do it's work so you become mature and well-developed, not deficient in any way.

"If you don't know what you're doing, pray to the Father. He loves to help. You'll get His help and won't be condescended to when you ask for it. Ask boldly, believingly, without a second thought.

"People who 'worry their prayers' are like wind-shipped waves. Don't think you're going to get anything from the Master that way, adrift at sea, keep all your options open.

"Anyone who meets a testing challenge head-on and manages to stick it out is mighty fortunate. For such persons loyally in love with God, the reward is life and more life.

"So, my very dear friends, don't get thrown off course. Every desirable and beneficial gift comes out of Heaven. The gifts are rivers of light cascading down from the Father of Light. There is nothing deceitful in God, nothing two-faced, nothing fickle. He brought us to life using the true Word, showing us off as the crown of all His creatures."

Pastor's Pen

The season of Pentecost begins with the first Sunday of June, the season celebrating the gift of the Holy Spirit. I believe that the season we are living through demands the presence and power of the Holy Spirit in believers' lives as much as any era before. In the void, people and groups are claiming the position that the Holy Spirit was meant to occupy in the lives of believers. Jesus' parting words to His disciples express the vital necessity of the Holy Spirit to infuse their lives, faith, and ministry with the very power of God: "Do not leave Jerusalem until the Father sends you the gift He promised, as I told you before. John baptized with water; but in just a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit .... But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be My witnesses, telling people about Me everywhere - in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:4, 5, 7,8)

The disciples were given power earlier in their walk with Jesus to serve with healing and deliverance, witnessing and ministry. Pentecost would mark the launch of the development and expansion of the Kingdom of God in the Church, the Body of Christ as the Holy Spirit would dwell in and work through believers, believers just like you and me.

Since the very beginning in the Garden, there has been an attempt to live the life God intends without Him. Today, people learn to live and adapt to whatever personal human power they can muster within or in connections with others. We see people exerting power

over others with their "words" and influence, at times by controlling the narrative through the news, social media, the internet—human alternatives to the very work and power of God. Because it mirrors something we are designed to receive from God alone, we are sometimes easily deceived to equate the "messages" we receive from society or personal reflection with the Word of God, His truth, and His power.

As we celebrate the gift of God's Spirit to the believers, the Church, take this time to remember, focus on, and engage the power and presence of God's Spirit in your life.
