Pastor's Pen

Breake...
Out with the PAIN.
In with the SPIRIT.

Spring.... New life.... Resurrection... Go ahead.... Take a walk.... BREATHE More than in what we may have called "normal" times, we need to rediscover our created need for the light, air, the regular, steady, predictable routine of daily living we were created to be sustained by, not only physically but spiritually. Many people have been feeling the effects of being isolated, indoors, constantly reminded of the stresses and strains we personally, or our families, our communities have been facing. We've been struggling with a depressive oppressive spirit that begs us even deeper into the chains of despair, frustration, fear, anger, pessimism, withdrawal. Faith in the living God Who created us, Who knows the very fiber of our being, Who, as my family used to say knows "what makes us tick!" has the power of healing, renewal, transformation that the very world around us begs us to notice in the natural. Think about it, we remember repentance, redemption and deliverance of Lent and the Passover in the Exodus; we celebrate the Resurrection in Jesus; we are challenged to not live our lives and ministries without the Holy Spirit's power, fruit, and direction (Pentecost).

As a young teen Christian, I went to my pastor when facing the challenges of living in an environment that wasn't friendly and supportive of faith, principled living, and evangelism, and basically said, "I can't do this!" I claimed Christ as He claimed me at Easter when everything was breaking into new life around me with a freshness and freedom, but my heart and life were



facing off a personal and surrounding world of darkness, difficulty, and danger. As he was so prone to do, turning my challenges to opportunities from God, his basic response was, "Gooood! You aren't supposed to do it on your own." He opened up his Bible to Ephesians 1:18-21 and read (actually made me read) "I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened, so that you will know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the boundless greatness of His power toward us who believe. These are in accordance with the working of the strength of His might which He brought about in Christ, when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come.

He asked, "Do you see it?! Just how much power does it take to raise the dead?? That same power is the desire and gift of God to you, His Holy Spirit, will lift you up when you're dead, when you can't go on, when you don't think you can "do it!"

I have a dear friend who checks in with me when facing personal and ministry challenges and when I say, "Goooood," she'll respond, "Arrgghhhh! I knew you would say that!" And, of course that's why she comes. She seeks to be reminded and then to pray God's power into her situation with revitalized direction and strength. Go ahead, right when you think you can't go on, you can't break free from the darkness - step "out"... breathe... physically – spiritually – personally... it's how He made you to live. ~Pastor Al.


