



Throughout life we acquire knowledge as we continuously learn, but more importantly it is to gain wisdom to properly use and apply that knowledge. How do we become "wise?" Proverbs 1:7 says, "The first step is to trust and reverence the Lord? Only fools refuse to be taught." A suggested study for individuals of any age, for family groups, or other groups is Proverbs. Proverbs, mostly written by Solomon, considered the wisest man who ever lived, covers a wide range of topics, such as, youth and discipline, family life, self-control, resisting temptation, business matters, your use of words, marriage, wealth and poverty, immorality, and other topics including wisdom. How did Solomon acquire wisdom? He asked God, and the Lord gave it to him (1 Ki. 3:3-14).

Proverbs has a special section called "thirty sayings of the wise", chapters 22:17-24:22, and then some more sayings to the end of chapter 24. As you study this book of the Bible one thing you need to consider, just as you study any portion of Scripture, remember it is pertinent to fully accept these words as stated in 2 Timothy 3:16-17, "The whole Bible was given to us by inspiration from God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us to do what is right. It is God's way of making us well prepared at every point, fully equipped to do good to everyone."



Mark 9:30, "They left that place and passed through Galilee. Jesus did not want anyone to know where they were, 31 because He was teaching His disciples. He said to them, 'The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men. They will kill Him, and after three days He will rise.' 32 But they did not understand what He meant and were afraid to ask Him about it. 33 They came to Capernaum. When He was in the house, He asked them, 'What were you arguing about on the road?' 34 But they kept quiet because on the way they had argued about who was the greatest. 35 Sitting down, Jesus called the Twelve and said, 'Anyone who wants to be first must be the very last, and the servant of all.' 36 He took a little child whom He had placed among them. Taking the child in His arms, He said to them, 37 'Whoever welcomes one of these little children in My welcomes Me: and whoever welcomes Me does not welcome Me but the One Who sent Me."

Was it just the Smith family, or have other parents ever had to deal with a difficult long trip in the car? You know how it is. The journey is long. The kids have no idea how long the trip is really going to be. They could be 10 hours away, and then it begins, "He's touching me!" "Why does she always get a window seat?" "Are we there yet?" "I don't feel good." "I'm hungry!" "She's sitting on my side." "It's hot in here." "I'm cold." "I've gotta go." One is crying and we're not really sure why, and maybe they're not either. Another pretends to be

out cold, asleep. Personally, you were actually looking forward to the journey itself, as well as what was at the destination, you were looking forward to simply being together.

It seems Jesus had similar problems with His "kids" on the journey. The disciples fussed over a number of things during their various journeys, but one thing remained the same, Jesus remained Who He was and stayed on course with His mission. There were even certain things about Jesus and His plans that they disagreed about, even the cross itself. It may have been very easy for Jesus to chide His disciples, "Stop acting like children!" Instead He reminded them, with a child, of their mission to participate in sacrificial service. His name and His Word would stand forever, and so would His desire to reach even those considered the "least" among them. Regardless, indeed in concert with, whatever the world would sinfully do with and to Jesus, His mission, His goal, His will remained steadfast: His gift of grace to free us from our sin and its grip, to fill us with His Spirit of Life and power to transform us to who we were created to be, to heal us from the damage sin had caused and empower us to be His disciples, ambassadors of His Kingdom.

Are we there yet?
No, but He's still leading.
Are we still following?
