From the Pastor:

Dear beloved brothers and sisters in Christ,

As this year draws to a close, we stand once again between what has been and what is yet to come.

Some of us look back with gratitude, others with regret and most of us, with a mixture of both.

Life rarely ends neatly by December. Some dreams remain unfinished, some prayers still wait for answers, and some wounds have not yet healed.

Yet one truth stands firm: God has been faithful. Moses once prayed, "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." (Psalms 90:12) He knew that wisdom begins when we see time not as an enemy, but as a gift each day another chance to walk with God.

When we realize how brief our life is, we begin to live more deeply, love more generously, and trust more fully.

As winter settles in, we echo the Psalmist's words: "Satisfy us in the morning with your unfailing love that we may sing for joy and be glad all our days." (Psalm 90:14)
Before we rush into resolutions or schedules, may our hearts find quiet rest in God's unchanging love new every morning, even in December's coldest dawn.

We may not have finished everything we hoped for this year.

We may carry disappointments, unfinished work, or unanswered prayers.

But take heart, our incomplete year rests in the hands of a perfect God.

He never stops working, and what feels unfinished to us may already be part of His perfect plan.

The German pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote these words from a prison cell:

"By gracious powers so wonderfully sheltered, we confidently await what may come; God is with us night and morning, and never fails to meet us each new day.

Faith is not the absence of fear, it is the courage to trust the One who shelters us in His grace.

So as we close this year, let us do so not with anxiety, but

DEVOTION

Luke, in his gospel, tells of a special man in his coverage of the birth of the Christ child. Luke 2:25- "And there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; and this man was looking for the consolation of Israel; and the Holy Spirit was upon him."

Notice how he is described:

Righteous: A person who is upright, virtuous keeping the e commandments of God. Someone who is committed to living life on God's terms and relates in an appropriate and fair manner with others.

Devout: A person who reveres God and allows that reverence to impact his life and choices. Someone consumed with honoring God.

Looking for the consolation of Israel: Simeon was living his life in anticipation of the Messiah-fixated on the future.

The Holy Spirit was upon him: This is interesting since the attachment of the Spirit of God to an individual began at Pentecost Luke 2:26—"And it had been revealed to him (Simeon) by the holy Spirit that he would not see death before

he had seen the Lord's Christ." Simeon would not die before he had seen the Lord's Christ. It appears that this promise radically affected Simeon's way of life as he spent his days in the temple, waiting to see the Messiah. When Joseph and Mary brought the child Jesus into the temple, Simeon took Him in his arms, blessed God and said-Luke 2:29-32, "Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation that you prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel. "Simeon knew immediately that this was the Messiah and saw that salvation was a Person, not a word. doctrine, or creed, and that all persons were included-Jew or Gentile. Luke 2: 34-35, "And Simeon blessed them (Joseph and Mary) and said to Mary, "Behold this child is appointed for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is opposed (and a sword will pierce through your own soul also), so that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed." Simeon here uttered three distinct prophecies

- Jesus would be either a stumbling stone or a stepping stone to God.
- 2)He would be a sign pointing to His identity
- 3) He would be a sword who would one day, pierce His mother's soul as she watched him die for the sins of the world.

May our celebration of the Christ's birth be defined by the unique contentment of the heart that comes from knowing Him.

all the "fixens". Some additional items needed at this time are: corn and red beets, baked beans, canned pasta, chunky soup, Ramen soup, cream soups, canned fruit, canned chicken, spam, tuna, juices, paper towels, dish liquid, other cleaning supplies, and shampoo.
