From the Pastor:

We have stepped into the new year with the ongoing call to discern where God is leading us in the next year... There are some things that speak to who we are as well as what we do that are part of the ongoing ministry of our congregation... All of us need to be trying to discern where it is that God is calling us to serve within and beyond the doors of the church – out in the community and maybe even beyond. I love the weight of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians in the twelfth chapter; he captures the ministry we are all called to in such organic imagery. We are all parts of a body with the "Master" at head control, and -- as members of His body we share the common "blood" of God's grace and life flowing through us, EACH ONE with parts to play in the master plan of God for our congregation, community, and the world around us. This is a crucial time for the church in history. In our own land there are increasing numbers of people who have no idea what the good news of the Gospel is. The world around us is increasingly secularized at the same time the church around the world has been increasingly institutionalized. To join Paul, we cannot come to the place where any of us can see ourselves as incidental – useless – not connected - or unimportant -- if we are connected to Christ. Whatever we do or be, whatever we are CALLED to do or be, is vital. Paul spoke to the Colossian believers in the 3rd chapter: "23 Whatever you do, [WHATEVER] - do your work heartily, as for the Lord rather than for men, ²⁴ knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance. It is the Lord Christ whom you serve." Paul told the Romans in Romans 12: "6 We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; 7 if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; 8 if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully." Over the years I have had many people, often shut-ins say -- "All I can do is pray!" My response normally is... "WHAT? ALL I can do is.... Then PRAY. Pray as the Bible calls you – fervently, constantly, with faith, without ceasing, earnestly, gladly....!! This is a GREAT gift!" We have a number of needs in the ministry of the church from helping with children's ministries, youth ministries, serving in leadership on the board or in supporting the pastor on SPR, helping with the cleaning of the church, serving and preparing meals, participating in VBS or Kids Club, mowing, shoveling snow... Whatever you are doing – do it with all your heart celebrating the blessing it is to serve Jesus. I am truly amazed at the MANY ways you all serve, some in places, times, and ways that no one knows – but I assure you – Jesus does! How we thank God for you! Know that it is no small thing to serve the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. If God puts something on your heart – let's discern it together. "The Joy of the Lord is our strength" and it is our strength to serve the Lord with joy. ~Pastor Al.

Charles Swindoll wrote, "When we

are over worked and exhausted, hope gives us fresh energy. When we are discouraged, hope lifts our spirits. When we are tempted to quit, hope keeps us going...When we fear the worst, hope brings reminders that God is still in control.

David Jeremiah wrote, "When we've anchored in eternity, we can weather the storms of time. Whatever happens to us, we know our future. The Lord is already there, and He is preparing a place for us. That makes us sanctified optimists. Today, anchor your personality on the hope Christ offers. Let that stabilize your emotions and sustain your spirits. Read Hebrews 6: 13-20.

Hebrews 6:19 "We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain."

The Psalmist wrote in Psalms 42: 5+6(a) "Why are you down cast, O my soul? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise Him, my Savior, and my God."

Who is like you, God?

[PONDER Con't] "HOPE"

1 Peter 1:3 "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to His great mercy, He has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead."

Worldly hope is merely wishful thinking and ends at the grave. Christian <u>hope</u> is based on a person, the living and resurrected Christ, -The firm foundation!

Alister E. McGrath wrote the following.

A Symbol of Hope

The cross is a potent symbol of Christian realism. It declares that nay outlook on life that cannot cope with the grim realities of suffering and death does not deserve to get a hearing. This symbol of suffering and death affirm that Christianity faces up to the grim, ultimate realities of life. It reminds us of something we must never be allowed to forget. God entered into our suffering and dying world in order to bring it newness of life. Those outside Christianity need to learn-need to be told about-its relevance and power for the tragic situation of humanity. It is a sign of a glory that is concealed. It confronts the worst that the world can offer and points to-and makes possible-a better way. It stands as a symbol of hope that transfigures, in a world that is too often tinged with sadness and tears.

So consider the cross. A symbol of death? No, a symbol of a world of death and suffering? Not quite. A symbol of hope in the midst of a world of death and suffering? Yes! A symbol of a God who is with us in this dark world, and beyond? Yes! In short, the cross stands for a hope that is for real, in a world that is for real. But that world will pass away, while that hope will remain for eternity.

Sing wholeheartedly "My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus blood and righteousness. On Christ the solid rock I stand."
