From the Pastor:

Have you ever been engaged a similar conversation to this... "I just bought a new truck." "What'd you get?" "A 2018 Ford F150." "That's not a new truck!" "It's new to me." We quickly learn that there are different ways of understanding "New". Sometime over the last couple weeks many of us have wished someone "Happy New Year!" Indeed, we have entered 2025. We've never been here before. Yet, just the same – we are not fooled – there is a lot of 2024 that remains, in fact – most of what we have on January 1 is the same as December 31. Not only can "new" be somewhat elusive, but there are all kinds of "re....." items in our day as well. There's recycled, refreshed, renewed, remanufactured, recovered, refurbished, retreads, rebuilt, reconditioned and then some with special spiritual significance to us – redeemed... reconciled... Sometimes people add "newly" to some of them and then of course as people of faith we talk about new life, new born/born again...

As you begin this new year, what about taking some "new" steps spiritually. The Bible has some truly fantastic, overwhelming promises. Perhaps you know and love someone, maybe it's you!, who is stepping out into new life right now! Many of us have tried it on our own and ran out of steam. The wonderful good news of the Scriptures is that God Himself desires "new" and "re-..." for us and by His Spirit enables us to take the necessary steps. I've listed below some of the over-the-top promises from God's Word to claim and stand on if you desire to step beyond your will-power and be spirit -powered to go beyond your own ability and capacity. Why not trust the one who made you in the first place?

2 Corinthians 5:17 - "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come."

Romans 12:2 "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect."

Titus 3: 3 [the old...] For we too were once foolish, disobedient, deceived, enslaved to various lusts and pleasures, spending our life in malice and envy, hateful, hating one another. 4 But when the kindness of God our Savior and His love for mankind appeared, 5 He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we did in righteousness, but in accordance with His mercy, [the new...] by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit, 6 whom He richly poured out upon us through Jesus Christ our Savior, 7 so that being justified by His grace we would be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

Ephesians 4:22-24 "... put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness."

Colossians 3:9-10 "Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator."

I hope you will feel the joyfulness he expresses. John Gilmore wrote a short response to Zechariah's song titled "An Indestructible Joy." Zechariah's poem (song) was a relection of his theology. He attributed salvation to the work of God. What sustained him through his various vexations in life was God's acceptance of him.

Lift has its up's and down's, its crises and catastrophes, its gains and pains, its good and bad times. But life's tough spots become bearable when we have the confidence that all is right between us and God, that God has forgiven us of our sins. Troubles in life are hard to bear, but when our standing with God is on a secure basis, when we are accepted and loved by Him, we can endure the slings and arrows of outrageous fortune...

Partnering with Gretna Glen Camp

Sharing in ministry with our camps is a great opportunity to minister the message of Jesus with people of all ages. Each year Dave Gray sets up opportunities to serve in a very practical way by arranging for wood cutting and splitting at Gretna to support the camps and retreats with wood for campfires for the various groups. He shares... "The staff at Gretna Glen Camp thanks Jonestown UMC for special help in this important local mission project. I continue to look forward to the next trip in 2025. Thanks, David Gray. "In 2024, Gretna welcomed 137 Guest Groups, 6,867 guests, 906 campers with a total of 1261 registrations, 47 Summer Staff from 4 countries, over 3,000 hours of volunteer service outside of summer camp (e.g. wood cutting and splitting by Jonestown UMC), and \$51,569 of camper scholarship support, making camp accessible to even more families. The camp is currently working on phase 2 of building/renovating Carrie Lodge/ Health Center and will begin the development of new meadow/pool restrooms, a long needed update. Keep this ministry in your prayers and support as you are able in mission giving as well as volunteering to help.
