#### Remembering our calling to minister to and with one another in love...

We often recognize that in the Body of Christ, the church, we have many different types of callings... there are people with a variety of Spiritual gifts. Romans 12 (vss. 4-9) speaks of prophesying, teaching, encouraging, giving, and leading. Ephesians 4 (vss. 11-16) mentions prophets, evangelists, apostles, pastors, and teachers. Perhaps one of the most familiar passages is 1 Corinthians 12 (+1 Cor. 13) which lists wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, miracle working power, prophecy, discernment of spirits, speaking in various tongues and the interpretation of those messages, gifts available to apostles, prophets, teachers... While there is a little variation in each of the lists, the common connection between all of them is the common ingredient of "love." The Romans passage finished with "Love must be sincere." Ephesians 4 challenges the church "From him(Jesus) the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work." Of course, perhaps the most famous of all right after the passage on gifts and ministries - 1 Cor 13 which includes "4 Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. 5 It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. 6 Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. 7 It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. 8 Love never fails.

It is quite interesting to listen to people speak about churches as being really great or successful churches as they speak about the preaching, the teaching, the worship, the missions or community profile, the average attendance and sometimes even the physical facilities or size of budget. It would, however, seem that the consistent identifier of a Spirit-filled and Spirit-lead congregation will be the presence and deployment of God's love in, among, and through the people. In 1 Samuel chapter 15, God

speaks to Samuel and tells him that "He was sorry that He ever made Saul king because tuned his back on Him and he refuses to do what God had told him." Samuel had a long night of anger, disappointment and prayed and in the morning went to meet with Saul. When Samuel came to Saul and told him what God had said, Saul was defensive. Samuel responded-1 Samuel 15: 22 +23 "Do you think all God wants are sacrifices-empty rituals just for show? He wants you to listen to Him! Plain listening is the thing, not staging a lavish religious production. Not doing what God tells you is far worse than fooling around in the occult. Getting self-important around God is far worse than making deals with your dead ancestors. Because you said no to God's Command, He says no to your kingship. (The message version.) Thomas R. Kelly wrote an article entitled Holy Obedi-

ence.

Jesus put it rather bluntly and simply in John 13...  $^{34}$  "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another.  $^{35}$  By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

There are even those who have been critical of the church that would hold such a powerful and yet rather simple and plain command as meaningless or trite. It seems, however, that this was not only Jesus' command to us, but it was the very framework of HIS ministry – the motivation for His incarnation and presence in a fallen world, the lens through which He looked at a wandering and broken world and individuals, the precious lives that inhabited his path, as well as the ministry example He exhibited before His disciples. It is a powerful prayer to pray – "Jesus, teach me to love \_\_\_\_\_\_ as you love him/her/them. Teach me how to present Your grace, mercy, forgiveness, and new life to him/her/them in Your love."

Its joys are ravishing, its peace profound, its humility the deepest, its power world-shaking, its love enveloping, its simplicity that of a trusting child. Scripture you may want to read: 1 Samuel 15: 1-23; Psalms


Current study on Spiritual warfare - "Girl's With Swords" by Lisa Bevere. Some bits and pieces of our study:
