From the Pastor:

Paul wrote to the Christians at Colossae words of both encouragement and challenge to develop a solid faith and be committed disciples and witnesses. One of Paul's disciples, Epaphras, actually founded the church. The city and the church were plagued by a heresy that threatened to lead it away from Christ – a heresy that focused on human thought and a mysticism named Gnosticism. See if this belief system doesn't sound a bit familiar... "that God is good, but matter is evil, that Jesus Christ was merely one of a series of emanations descending from God and being less than God (a belief that led them to deny His true humanity and divinity), and that a secret, higher knowledge above Scripture was necessary for enlightenment and salvation".... "a secret higher knowledge above Scripture..." The early church faced many challenges as the people sought to be true to their new faith in Christ while put down by these "higher thinkers." It wasn't easy as they came from all kinds of families and backgrounds. Some came from some very orthodox beliefs and others from traditions and practices not centered on faith in a living God, from secular or even pagan backgrounds. The message of the Gospel was and is needed by every person, even if they considered the gospel beneath them. The Holy Spirit would be speaking in the depths of every person, no matter what their history or culture - they needed Jesus. To the converts Paul wrote in Colossians 2: 6 *So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, 7 rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness. 8 See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy, which depends on human tradition and the elemental spiritual forces of this world rather than on Christ. 9 For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form, 10 and in Christ you have been brought to fullness. He is the head over every power and authority.*

Dear Jonestown believers, as you have received Christ, stand firm in your faith no matter the response of the world around you, it's conditional acceptance or outright rejection of you and your faith. Live your lives in Him... develop roots and foundation in Jesus.. grow confidently strong in your Biblical faith... live in a state of gratitude not complaining or discouragement. Paul encourages them – and us - to be shaped and strengthened by their Christ theology and not the weak, deceiving and limited human philosophies laid upon the foundations of traditions and evil. Christ is Lord of all and above all limited human perspective. In Christ you will be complete when you live under the authority and in the power of Jesus Christ, our Lord and our God. As the Psalmist put it: (Psalm 37:) "3 Trust in the LORD and do good; dwell in the land and cultivate faithfulness. 4 Delight yourself in the LORD, and He will give you the desires of your heart. 5 Commit your way to the LORD; trust in Him, and He will do it." Amen.

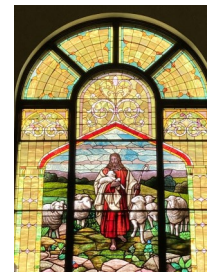

2024 Annual Conference and 2024 (Postponed from 2020) General Conference There were some major changes at both conferences this past year.

General Conference:

The amount of money coming from Annual Conferences to the General Church were reduced from a current base rate of 3.29% to 2.6% (2025-2026) and 2.9% (2027-2028 – if the collection rate is 90% or higher in '25-'26). This is an adjustment due to the residual effects of challenges from the pandemic and the impact of disaffiliation of approximately 20% of the churches from the denomination.

Revision of the Social Principles – first time in nearly 50 years. In addition to language changes regarding human sexuality and inclusiveness, advocating for human dignity and combating racism, caring for the planet and supporting healthy community settings for all people economically, socially, and politically.

The Paragraph 2553 offering a path for disaffiliation was officially ended.

Ordained Deacons are now permitted to preside at the sacraments – Holy communion and Baptism – in their appointed assignments. This is especially helpful for those serving as chaplains.

The removal from the Book of Discipline the prohibitions of appointment and ordination of “self-avowed practicing homosexuals” and also the prohibition of performing same-sex marriages. Language protecting the rights of pastors to still determine what marriages they will/will not perform and also for the churches to make a determination of what services will be held within their facilities. This particular action brought forward the re-instatement of a pastor’s orders who had them removed under the previous language of the discipline.

Annual Conference:

The Annual Conference, in line with the General Conference approved the change to a new pension program for the conference and denomination. This new program is a personal and private type program funded by the churches and pastors and monitored and facilitated but not funded by the annual conference.

There were nine churches closed.

A memorandum of understanding was established to consolidate staffing and leadership between the Greater New Jersey Annual Conference and ours in Eastern PA.

A budget for the E PA Conference was approved.
