From the Pastor:

I remember the night well, coming to a meeting with the Staff/Pastor Parish Relations Committee in one of the classrooms in the area on the second floor above the narthex. I was asked by the District Superintendent to be appointed here for a year while the conference was facing clergy shortages and uncertain times, trying to regroup from a variety of challenges post Covid, the denominational turmoil causing some pastors and churches to explore disaffiliation, and high numbers of retirements with lower numbers of those entering ministry. I had heard of the Jonestown Church but had not met the people nor engaged with her ministry. What a blessing lay in store. It has been my privilege to serve this phenomenal fellowship of disciples that hold a breadth of gifts, passions, and ministries. Thank you! Mary and I have been so very blessed to be invited and welcomed into your "family" in love, fellowship, and ministry. Borrowing the words of Paul, my prayer for you as individuals as well as a congregation is that you will continually seek and discover the vision as he had for the church at Ephesus:

[Ephesians 4:] 1...I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. ² Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. ³ Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. 4 There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; 5 one Lord, one faith, one baptism; 6 one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.... [Paul went on with his vision...] ...¹¹ So Christ [gifted various spiritual leaders...], 12 to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up 13 until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. ¹⁴ Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. 15 Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. 16 From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work."

Those words express my heart desire for each of the churches I have served over the last near 50 years. We live in a deeply divided world. Nations are divided. Cultures are divided. There is division in communities and families. In fact, many individuals are divided within their hearts. And yes, many churches are divided over a variety of issues. Here Paul was inspired to offer a different way with a different heart with a vision to a new day where God's people would stand as united in faith as a foundation.

Stay faithful to Jesus, brothers and sisters in Christ. Seek to be a gateway for people to discover the heart of God for them. The world may not appreciate hearing about transformative power of the Gospel we share; but may it never be able to say that it had no opportunity to see the impact it has had on our lives. Thank you for your welcome and opportunity to serve with you.

God spoke to Fzekiel con-

cerning the sins of Israel in Chapter 14 of Ezekiel.

Ezekiel 14: 12-14 "And the word of the Lord came to me; 'Son of man, when a land sins against me by acting faithlessly, and I stretch out my hand against it and break its supply of break and send famine upon it, and cut off from it man and beast, even if these three men, Noah, Daniel, and Job, were in it, they would deliver but their own lives by their righteousness, declares the Lord God.""

RED ROSE SUNDAY:



Commitment to obeying God. And third, you could anticipate that life would present tests that would prove your vindication before God in the face of staunich opposition. All those assumptions of a young man in Jerusalem named Daniel. He was among the first captives taken from Jerusalem to Babylon in 605 B.C. In Babvlon, his commitment to God was tested repeatedly, and he passed every tests. Daniel never returned to Jerusalem. His pagan captors singled Daniel out for having incredible wisdom and gifts from God-especially the ability to interpret dreams and visions. Daniel was happy to use his training, intelligence, and spiritual gifs as long as his service did not compromise his faithfulness to God.

Philip P. Bliss wrote a hymn called "Dare to be a Daniel." It has four verses which challenge person to stand by a true purpose and hold the gospel banner high. There is also the chorus, which has been taught to children over the years in primary Sunday school classes and in bible schools.

"Dare to be a Daniel, Dare to stand alone! Dare to have a purpose firm! Dare to make it known!"

Most of us will probably never live to see our names in lights. But if we pursue and apply the wisdom of God's word and —as best we know how—live our lives to point others towards Christ, we will some how reflect God's beauty and glory lighting up the skies of the new heaven.

They are open the first and third Tuesdays from 10-12, and Thursdays from 4-7, two Mondays (second and fourth) 10-12, and one Saturday (third) a month from 10-1:00 ,which is Community Shopping Day.
