

From the Pastor:

Lent begins for our congregation with a worship service at Jonestown UMC on Ash Wednesday at 7PM and continues for 40 days through Easter. People who add up the days will often come back to us and inform us that we have a problem counting. What they may not have been aware of is that the Sundays are not counted in the 40 days of Lent. Every Sunday is considered a mini-Easter, the celebration of life in God's grace and mercy, a time for worship and celebration. At the same time, the other days of Lent are observed with a number of spiritual disciplines – fasting, praying, reading the scriptures, serving others in need... I have known a number people over the years who have embarked on very difficult and challenging disciplines over the Lenten season that became unsustainable over the long haul. One brother in Christ embarked on a season of fasting for 40 days as Jesus did in the wilderness. While it was indeed quite a spiritual adventure for this brother, it was not something that he could realistically do the rest of his life. I would like to encourage you to step out on a spiritual adventure that will be a primer for the spiritual discipline of the rest of your life. Start with something that will draw vou into the scriptures, into prayer, into the presence of God in an ongoing way, not only for 40 days, but perhaps for the rest of your life one day at a time. You may say – "I'd like to spend an hour in prayer every day through the Lenten Season, but if your prayer life is very sporadic, the likelihood of this becoming a lifelong commitment is rather slim. Instead, take your eyes off the clock and begin a discipline of having a conversation with God in prayer every day trusting your day to Him, lifting up a prayer for others you know that may need God's healing, presence, strength, wisdom, deliverance..., pray for yourself and your day seeking an awareness of God's presence, love, and grace... praying for God's revelation of ministry you may be engaged in to His glory. 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 (NIV) 16 Rejoice always, 17 pray continually, 18 give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. Imagine heeding some of the very simple instructions of Jesus that are in the Bible like these from Paul in 1 Thessalonians. My praver for each of you is that the Lenten season awakens in each person who opens their heart to new spiritual life and health a renewed joy, an ongoing conversation with the Lord, a spirit of thanksgiving and praise that follows you day by day, and a confidence that you are walking in the very center of God's will for you in these things through Jesus.

This Saturday is also Community Shopping Day. This means it is open for any Northern Lebanon resident to shop for a monetary donation.
