From the Pastor:

Over 50 years ago, Andrae Crouch wrote a song entitled "My Tribute" with the words: "How can I say thanks for the things You have done for me? Things so undeserved yet You gave to prove Your love for me; The voices of a million angels could not express my gratitude all that I am and ever hope to be-I owe it all to Thee... To God be the glory for the things He has done... With His blood He has saved me, with His power He has raised me.." The words reflect the heart of a psalmist, not so far from David himself. Yet they and the Psalms of the Bible stand so distinct as they express such heartfelt gratitude from either the lack of any response or a mere obligatory pair of words acknowledging some sort of exchange-perhaps of a gift or action that has been extended to another. Psalm 9 begins with the challenge: "I will give thanks to you, Lord, with all my heart; I will tell of all Your wonderful deeds. I will be glad and rejoice in You; I will sing the praises of Your name, O Most High." "I will be glad and rejoice IN YOU...for all the wonderful deeds. When we consider the thanks Crouch and David expressed we can identify a depth of impact God has had on their lives. Several things stand out that far surpass obligation:

First, notice the recognition of personal connection between the giver, the gift, and the receiver. True thanksgiving focuses most deeply on the relationship between the giver and receiver and far less on the gift exchanged between them. It reflects on the heart of the giver, the love, compassion, the hopefulness they have about the life of the one to whom the gift is given. "I will rejoice and be glad in You."

Second, true thanksgiving is focused not on what is in the hand of the giver, but what is in the heart of the giver for the receiver. Who of us hasn't been frustrated at some point with the realization that no gift-no matter the size, the cost, the uniqueness-no gift ever begins to satisfy our desire to embody our love for the one we present a gift to? What is in the heart far exceeds what is in the hand. Many people focus on what is in God's hand and miss the greater gift-what is in His heart for them. What can compare to the tremendous love of God which is unceasing, unfailing, and unending?

Third, thanksgiving humbles us to recognition the difference between God and us. God is so immensely greater than us. (Con't next page...)



PONDER with Lewis.... Thankfulness Sometimes it might seem

that a simple "thank you" to God is not enough to express your appreciation. In 1 Chronicles 16: 8-36 is a thanksgiving to the Lord that David, King of the Israelites, provided to Asaph, who was the director of the choral group of priests. It was the beginning of using choirs in the tabernacle to sing thanksgiving to the Lord. 1 Chronicles 16: 8-11 "Oh give thanks to the Lord and pray to Him; yes, sing His praises and tell of His marvelous works. Glory in His holy name; Let all rejoice who seek the Lord. Seek the Lord: yes, seek His strength and seek His face continually"

The Psalmist put it this way (8: 4-9): What is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him? Yet you have made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honor. You have given him dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under his feet, all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field, the birds of the heavens and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas. O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is Your name in all the earth! As you take the opportunity this month to be thankful, perhaps we can all allow our thanksgiving to broaden and deepen from our gratitude for the things God has given and done to swell in praise to our Almighty God, Sacrificial Savior, Transforming power of the Holy Spirit. Ever notice that when someone simply says "Thank you!" to us, our response is often- "for what??". We are somewhat taken back when if they simply respond- "for you". God understands when we simply live with gratitude for Him. Everything He does to, for, or with us is but a reflection of His heart for you. ~Pastor Al.

[PONDER Con't]

As you study the entire Psalm (see Psalm 105: 1-15) and note the four elements of true thanksgiving found in this song; 1-remembering what God has done; 2-telling others about it; 3-showing God's glory to others; and 4-offering gifts of self, time and resources.

Get into the habit of fully expressing thanks to God. There is a hymn "Thank You Lord". It's chorus is a good one to sing frequently.

"Thank you Lord, for saving my soul, Thank you Lord, for making me whole, Thank you Lord, forgiving me thy great salvation so rich and free."

A last thought for your Thanksgiving, celebration which is generally a gathering of family and friends, consider Jesus' words spoken in Luke 14: 13 + 14-"But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just." Ask God who might need special help which you might be able to provide.


