

From the Pastor:

This month is a month of celebration of giving thanks – we thank God for God Himself in worship, we give thanks to God for the harvest and blessings, we thank God for our veterans and their service, we name our thanks with and to others. In a time when gifts and blessings are often considered expected, earned or entitled, true heartfelt thanksgiving is often understood more as obligatory than humbly offered. I remember one of those teachable moments when one of my children seemed confused by my expectation that he express thanks, gratitude, to someone for paying them after helping them with some chores they needed assistance with. The person would not consider my son's help unless he would be able to pay him. My son, however, understood the payment as a commitment fulfilled not a gift given. When he later asked me about the expectation of expressing thanks, I told him his gratitude was not only about the payment, but as much, or more, as it was for the opportunity to serve, honor and serve an elder, and participate in God's love for the man and his wife.

I hear some of these same sentiments from people about worship and thanksgiving to God. God's mercy and love, sacrifice and calling are often seen more as expectations that reflections on the heart of God. I find it interesting that the Bible reflects the many colors of this humble calling on our walk with God – worship, thanksgiving, praise, adoration...

The prophet Isaiah writes: **Isaiah 12:4-5** And on that day you will say, "**Give thanks** to the LORD, call on His name. Make known His deeds among the peoples; make them remember that **His name is exalted**." **Praise the LORD** in song, for He has done glorious things; let this be known throughout the earth. Of we find in **1 Chronicles 16:34** Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; for His steadfast love endures forever! The Psalmist invites us in **Psalm 100:4** "Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise: be thankful unto Him, and bless His name"

In this last verse FOUR different Hebrew words are employed to add color, perspective, and depth to this calling: *"Enter His gates with a gift of thanks (towdah – a word for a thank offering), His courts with songs of praise (tehillah – a word for a song of praise)! Raise your hands in thanksgiving (yadah – a word for extending our hands in praise and thanksgiving) to him; Humbly kneel (barak – a word for kneeling before God in humble submission) before his name!" We express our praise, our thanks, our surrender to GOD, our Lord. It is impossible to fully embrace His greatness, His grace, His power, His sacrifice, His gift of life.... I think of thanksgiving, praise, and worship in this way...*

- I give thanks/*thanksgiving* in recognition of what God has done for, to, with, through me... for <u>His activity</u>.
- I *praise* him for what he has <u>accomplished</u> and the impact God has made on my life, on the world;
- I *worship* God as a recognition of <u>who God is</u>, the almighty, everlasting, GOD... a God of grace and glory, a God of love and mercy, a God who is faithful and relentless in His loving pursuit of each of us. [Con't Next Page]

committed to Asaph and his associates a Psalm of Thanks to the Lord. Note these vers (8) "Give thanks to the Lord, call on His name; make known among the nations what He has done. (9) Song to Him, sing praises to Him; tell of all His wonderful acts. (10) Glory in His holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice. (11) Look to the Lord and His strength; seek His face always. (12a) Remember the wonders He has done."

Seth and Bessie Sykes wrote the hymn "Thank You, Lord". Here are the chorus words.

"Thank you, Lord, for saving my soul, Thank you, Lord, for making me whole, Thank you, Lord, for giving to me thy great salvation so rich and free."

Psalm 100 is titled "For giving thanks." (1) Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.(2) Worship the Lord with gladness; come before Him with joyful songs. (3) Know that the Lord is God. It is He who

made us, and we are His; we are His people, the sheep of His pasture. (4) Enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise; give thanks to Him and praise His name. (5) For the Lord is good and His love endures forever; His faithfulness continues through all generations."

Colossians 2: 6 and 7 "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live in Him, rooted and built up in Him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness." Colossians 3: 1-17 has a subtitle "Rules for Holy Living." Here are the words of Col 3: 15-17; (15) Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace and be thankful. (16) Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom, and as you sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. (17) And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the Name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him."

August Lidwig Storm (Swedish) wrote the hymn "Thanks to God for My Redeemer." here are thing he lists that he was thankful about. Thank for: my Redeemer, his provisions, memories, Jesus by my side, spring time, summer, winter, fall, tears, peace, answered prayers, unanswered prayers, storms in his life, God's provisions to him, pain and pleasure, comfort, grace beyond measure, uncomparable love, roses along the way and thorns, home and fire side, hope, joy, sorrow, heavenly peace, hope in tomorrow, and for all eternity. Step into each day with thanksgiving, knowing that God's love is strong, available and stabilizing and that all challenges can be faced in His strength. God's love stands when all else has fallen.
