From the Pastor:

**“Stand firm...”** One of the powerful challenges to the believer that shows up in many of Paul’s letters is “to stand...”. If someone stood in front of us at a meeting, in church, or in some gathered setting and ordered the group: “Stand!” most people would either rise to their feet or if they are already upright adjust their posture to be even more identifiably erect. “Stand!”

Paul, however, is not simply asking us to adjust our position in his letters to the churches, he is challenging them to something far more intentional. Two of my favorite occasions Paul exhorts the people of God to “Stand!” are in Ephesians 6. In verse 11 Paul challenges the believers to prepare to meet our spiritual opponent, not only for ourselves but for others. He challenged the first believers and us to: “Put on the full armor of God, so that you will be able to **stand firm** against the schemes of the devil.” He is calling the believers to a position of readiness as well as opposition to the deceiving lies and ways of the devil and all who would participate in his plans and activities. **STAND!**

Just two verses later he repeats himself - Ephesians 6:13  
“Therefore, take up the full armor of God, so that you will be able to resist in the evil day, **and having done everything, to stand firm.**” The Greek word is ἵστημι (histēmi). It is translated in different ways, each of which adds another color of richness to what Paul is calling the believer to. Among other uses, it is used meaning:

- to make to stand, to take a position.
- to establish, confirm.
- to stand fast, be firm, be permanent, endure.

Do you see it? It is to take a position of strength and firm resolution. It isn’t a picture of hyperactivity or loud boastful declaration, pushing or shoving, not cowering down giving up. It isn’t puffing oneself up on pride nor bending over in low esteem. Simply **STAND... stand firm....!** When someone calls us to take or make a stand, the call is a position of confidence and readiness. The Philistine Goliath tried that stand of pride. It is not only *that* we stand, but who we stand with and in... ourselves, the crowd around us, or in our God, the Lord of all. Goliath stood, took a stand, alone on his own size and arrogance against the army of God’s people. David finally had to remind both the Philistines and also the people of God, that he was taking his stand on and in the name of the Lord God, the Almighty. 1 Samuel 17:16  
“The Philistine (Goliath) came forward morning and evening for forty days and took his stand.” David stood on his faith... “...I come to you in the name of the Lord of Heaven’s Armies – the God of the armies of Israel...”

There are many other verses in Paul’s letters that add weight and invitation to strength and boldness. In 1 Corinthians 16:13 Paul tells the believers to... “Be on the alert, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong.” He challenges the believer to be on the alert and not become victim to a surprise attack. Be prepared. Stand!

from “The Message” “You do well when you complete the Royal Rule of the scriptures: “Love others as you love yourself! But if you play up to these so called important people, you go against the Rule and stand convicted by it. You can’t pick and choose in these things, specializing in keeping one or two things in God’s law and ignoring others. The same God who said, “Don’t commit adultery,” also said “Don’t murder.” If you don’t commit adultery but go ahead and murder, do you think your non-adultery will cancel out your murder? No, you’re a murder, period.”

“Talk and act like a person expecting to be judged by The Rule that sets us free. For if you refuse to act kindly, you can hardly expect to be treated kindly. Kind mercy wins over harsh judgment every time.”

Don Anderson wrote a short article referring to these verses. And others called called—

Paul challenges the believers to not simply be drawn to the newest and brightest, but be aware of how it aligns with the ongoing work of God and the solid foundation of the position of God. 2 Thessalonians 2:15 "So then, brethren, stand firm and hold to the traditions which you were taught, whether by word of mouth or by letter from us." We live in a season when we have been taught to be suspect of what has been understood in the past, rather than to trust the teachings of God's Word as the well tested truth and firm foundation to move forward with and upon.

Paul challenges believers to stand together, in the unity of their faith and solidarity in the Spirit, in Philippians 1:27 "Only conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or remain absent, I will hear of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel..."

Dear friends in Christ - - STAND! Stand up in Christ and upon His truth. Stand for the Gospel. Stand by one another and most importantly by Christ whose body you are. Stand under the direction of the Lord. Stand firm not easily pushed aside. Whatever you do... STAND!

An equally valid signpost of spiritual growth is that we are learning to love even those who are tough to love. We grow as God's love grows in us, and welcome His channels to show His love to others. We are spurred on to tell the unsaved world about the Lord Jesus Christ. We begin to want the best for other people, no matter who they are, how they dress or what they do, because God's love is a love without partiality...

No matter who we are, we are one in our need for the Savior. God is no respecter of persons. "For God does not show favoritism." (Romans 2:11) God long for fellowship with everyone. The ugly and the beautiful, the cultured and the crude, the wealthy socialite and the welfare mother. We are all the same in significance to Him. I was a Christian for many years before I discovered that I could grow spiritually through expressing my love to others. **2024 Annual Conference and 2024 (Postponed from 2020) General Conference** There were some major changes at both conferences this past year.

***General Conference:***

The amount of money coming from Annual Conferences to the General Church were reduced from a current base rate of 3.29% to 2.6% (2025-2026) and 2.9% (2027-2028 – if the collection rate is 90% or higher in '25-'26). This is an adjustment due to the residual effects of challenges from the pandemic and the impact of disaffiliation of approximately 20% of the churches from the denomination.

Revision of the Social Principles – first time in nearly 50 years. In addition to language changes regarding human sexuality and inclusiveness, advocating for human dignity and combating racism, caring for the planet and supporting healthy community settings for all people economically, socially, and politically.

The Paragraph 2553 offering a path for disaffiliation was officially ended.

Ordained Deacons are now permitted to preside at the sacraments – Holy communion and Baptism – in their appointed assignments. This is especially helpful for those serving as chaplains.

The removal from the Book of Discipline the prohibitions of appointment and ordination of “self-avowed practicing homosexuals” and also the prohibition of performing same-sex marriages. Language protecting the rights of pastors to still determine what marriages they will/will not perform and also for the churches to make a determination of what services will be held within their facilities. This particular action brought forward the re-instatement of a pastor’s orders who had them removed under the previous language of the discipline.

***Annual Conference:***

The Annual Conference, in line with the General Conference approved the change to a new pension program for the conference and denomination. This new program is a personal and private type program funded by the churches and pastors and monitored and facilitated but not funded by the annual conference.

There were nine churches closed.

A memorandum of understanding was established to consolidate staffing and leadership between the Greater New Jersey Annual Conference and ours in Eastern PA.

A budget for the E PA Conference was approved.

There were three ministers ordained as elders including the pastor at Kochenderfer UMC – Jeff Kapp (son-in-law of Rev. Dr. Rodney Shearer who has recently spoken at our Red Rose Sunday); Four individuals were commissioned toward elders orders and one toward deacons orders.

**Disaffiliation—General Conference/Annual Conference/Jonestown UMC**

As mentioned above, the door through the normal disaffiliation process has officially closed as of December 31, 2023. Because of the threatened anticipated expense levied against churches in our conference, our church and 50+ other churches entered a legal challenge to allow our congregation to depart the denomination. To update, we are awaiting what is called “Summary Judgement” by the judge in Montgomery County hearing the case who will decide if there are sufficient ground to proceed and hear the case in court. If so, the case may be heard in the first half of 2025. If he refuses to move the case forward, congregations will face a choice to stay or pursue other directions for the future. We’ll keep you posted. Keep our leadership, the Conference leadership, and the court in your prayers as we continue to attempt to seek/discern God’s direction forward.

In response to some inquiries I am including the info on the church activity last years as to our support of missions. Some of these items are ongoing and some are monthly and some are budgeted items. In 2023 we gave the following to the missionaries that we support though budgeted amounts.

Heinsmans/Team	\$1300.00
Pahutskis/Pioneers	\$1300.00
Samuteb Hospital	700.00
Our Daily Bread	\$100.00

In addition these we support through our monthly special offerings, On these what comes during the month goes directly out to the mission.

January - AMMI \$225.00

February -JOY \$998.00 (Some people give to this all year long and everything goes to JOY)

March -Lenten Offering \$205.00 (This is decided each year by the board to support a special need. In 2023 it went to Back to school blessing through the NL Ministerium.

April – Camping \$425.00 Usually on one of the months we get a special offering for what was Camping Scholarships. With the few campers we are supporting right now we have changed April, to NL Ministerium. We do have people that support Gretna Glenn on a regular basis and anything that comes in for Gretna or the Camping scholarships we give directly to the Camp.

May -UMCOR \$1058.00 Disaster relief through One Great Hour of Sharing

June -Red Rose \$6245.00 The Trustees are supposed to designate a project each year for this offering. None was designated in 2023.

July-ALIGN \$350.00

August -LCCM \$825.00

September -Shoebox \$1200.00 This is for the shoebox postage for the boxes we fill. This is handled through Samaritans Purse.

October – Lebanon Rescue Mission \$1735.00

November -Bill Lovelace \$330.00

December -Northern Lebanon Ministerium \$1294.00 Each year December is designated by the Ad. Board. In 2023 It was decided to give it to The newly formed Northern Lebanon Ministerium to help with start up costs.

Usually on one of the months we get a special offering for what was Camping Scholarships. With the few campers we are supporting right now we have changed the to April offering to the Northern Lebanon Ministerium. We do have people that provide support to Gretna Glenn on a regular basis and anything that comes in for Gretna or the Camping scholarships we give directly to the Camp.

I hope this helps clear up any questions on the missions of JUMC and how the offerings are designated.

In the future I will try to update more often probably on a quarterly basis.

In the mean time pleas contact me with any questions you may have.
